Do you know Centrum Slniečko?

Centrum Slniečko has been around for 21 years. By the way, that is my lucky number. Twenty one years of setting up a system to benefit children and women experiencing violence; to benefit families in crisis, and victims of domestic violence. Twenty one years of experience with violence in various forms; victories and losses against a broken system; ignorance and trivialization of issues. But these were also years of finding understanding, supporters and great people on our journey to set up a system where it appears to be missing.

Violence is most often aimed at the most vulnerable and the weakest – children, women, the elderly or disabled people. The basic premise at the very start of this center was, and of course, still is, to make children's lives better, happier, more carefree and without the presence of violence. Life is not only about luck, but it also brings conflicts we can get stuck in, problems, sadness, violence. Gradually, we expanded our target group to include women experiencing violence along with their children, families in crisis, and victims of domestic abuse. We also added programs and projects to strengthen their protection, safety, professional help, and prevention.

So how exactly has everything happened and what has Centrum Slniečko achieved?

The first crisis center for children and mothers with children in Slovakia was established by combining extraordinary practical experience with the courage to create something meaningful that would let abused children get help before becoming a danger for society and ending up in "re-educational" facilities. The first few years of building the crisis center consisted of finding a suitable family house, renovating it, doing thousands of hours of volunteer work, securing building material, donors and grants. It was a facility for mothers with children. Then we acquired another house, where we would place children suspected to be sexually or otherwise abused, while the original crisis center stayed a safe haven for mothers with children. Following the amendment of the law on social and legal protection of children, in 2019, both facilities together became the Center for Children and Families with a specialized program for maltreated and sexually abused children, ready to admit 20 clients. However, it was later shown that the adequate number of children with such severe trauma needs to be lowered to a maximum of 6 children per group.

We were able to expand street social work and outpatient counseling in the comfort of a family home thanks to the support of The Velux Foundation from 2014 and later through an ESF grant. A number of families; parents in crisis; courts of law; offices of labor, social affairs and family; and schools started to turn to Centrum Slniečko, and gradually, an intervention team of social workers, a special education teacher and a psychologist was formed. We began resolving the issues of children who have been suffering. On one hand, we were enthusiastic, we put our hearts into the demanding work, we were happy that our effort was acknowledged even by relatively distant foreign countries, but on the other hand, there was sorrow, as we were almost "invisible" to our own country in the same way that the issue of abused and molested children is. I remember the first meeting with Anders, a consultant from The Velux Foundation, who, after seeing us work, experiencing the atmosphere of our facility with all the children, immediately told us: "Ladies, if it was at all possible to carry everything you do over to Denmark, I would take you there right this minute."

The second facility that Centrum Slniečko opened for victims of domestic violence was the so-called **Safe House shelter.** Within the meaning of the law on social services, it is a shelter for women experiencing violence and their children after crisis intervention. We realized that after receiving urgent help, they lack opportunities to restart their life as a result of low income. Simply put, there was and still is no system of subsequent help for women experiencing violence and victims of domestic abuse.

Half of the family house was provided for this exact purpose by the city of Nitra. With the help of some great people and donors, we did a partial renovation, and the house is still of use to mums with children. Our goal is to expand and renovate the whole house in order to serve a higher number of women and children. At the end of last year, we submitted a project for Norwegian Financial Mechanism in partnership with the city of Nitra, so we may reach this objective after all.

We realized we needed more spots for kids, because for a long time, we were the only two organizations in Slovakia working with children suffering from the so-called CAN syndrome and providing crisis intervention and specialized treatment programs. That is why we opened a specialized facility for women experiencing violence and their children in 2015, the so-called Women's Safe House, with the support of the Norwegian Financial Mechanism and state budget. It is the first specialized facility in Slovakia that meets the minimal standards of the Council of Europe for providing services to women experiencing violence and their children, able to admit 17 clients. The enthusiasm we put in its establishment and operation wore off just before the funding of the project stopped and we found ourselves in a financial vacuum. During the project's implementation, this type of specialized facility or its appropriate way of funding did not make its way to legislation, and it is still funded by self-governing regions as emergency housing facilities with a very low, unsustainable contribution. At that time there was no grant in sight either. It should be stated that several government reserve contributions had helped the project at the end. In the long run, this is not a systemic approach. Tense situation, facility in danger, exhaustion and stress of those providing support and assistance to victims, stemming from fear of what is to come, if funding will be secured or not, if they will be able to continue helping or not, all led to those

who were helping suddenly becoming the "victims" of a flawed system. Here, I must thank the Nitra Self-Governing Region as the only authority to respond with sufficient support in years that followed, thanks to which we were able to maintain the quality of our services and 24-hour availability of the Women's Safe House. Current legislation is still missing the definition of services for children, psychological and legal support, spatial conditions and safety regulations. A solution would be to specify this kind of specialized facility in the upcoming law on crisis intervention.

In running of the Crisis Center for women experiencing violence and their children, we understood that before they are admitted to the center, it is essential for them to be interviewed in the counseling center, where the type of violence is identified, legal and social situation of the client or victim of domestic violence is analyzed, and the severity of the risk is assessed. This resulted in the launch of the Counseling Service for Victims. Through the years of its existence, hundreds of women experiencing violence and victims of domestic abuse have gone through it. The number of domestic violence cases has grown during the Covid-19 pandemic. Long before the pandemic, however, Centrum Slniečko, in cooperation with the Regional Police Force Directorate in Nitra and within the partnership agreement, has been helping the victims of domestic violence, in whose cases the act of expulsion of the violent person has occurred. Our cooperation was the basis for a legislative change under the auspices of the President of the Slovak Republic, Zuzana Čaputová, and in the course of 2021, the act on victims of crimes was amended to include intervention centers, that stipulate the cooperation of counseling centers for victims of domestic violence

with the police force in legislative terms as well.

An especially difficult situation arises when a woman experiencing violence together with her children wants to become independent. She will not be able to pay rent due to low income, which often causes her to return to her abuser. For that reason, Centrum Slniečko has been cooperating with the organization Dostupný domov, n. o. (Affordable Home, NPO) which provides apartments to mothers with children at a lower rent rate than a commercial one. At the end of 2021, we secured support from ESF that allows us to partially help women, women with children, and victims of domestic violence, to pay rent in their first new home - per housing first model - and overcome the difficult period of time to start a new life without violence. By the end of the year, we had 6 available apartments in Nitra. However, this is not only about housing. Housed mothers with children also get free social counseling and, of course, if necessary, the support of Counseling Service for Victims and Intervention Center. When I see moms tearing up while signing the lease, I tell myself that the hard work we do is meaningful.

Years of experience have made us realize that it is necessary to pass our knowledge on to the younger colleagues, teachers, psychologists, police officers and doctors in order to avoid secondary victimization, and to make sure that people who work with children are able to identify the signs of violence and start helping. We designed education courses Bruises on the Soul I and Bruises on the Soul II, which cover the appropriate and inappropriate approach of individual professionals to the intervention in cases where children are sexually or psychologically abused. Bruises on the Soul III focuses on gender-based violence and stories of women from Women's

Safe House, showing the dynamics of violence, and the ways to handle these stressful situations. I am especially proud of another project, a dream come true - the prevention program aiming to eliminate violence against and among children called Kozmo and his Adventures. Hundreds of teachers and psychologists have been trained through it, thousands of children have taken part in it. Kozmo, the cosmonaut, teaches them how to differentiate between appropriate and inappropriate behavior, how to approach otherness, how to solve non-violent conflicts, and what to do with violence. All of this is taken care of by professionals from **EduCAN**. Their mission is educating the public as well, which they do through great podcasts on the platform bezmodrin. sk or through campaigns. One of those took place on Valentine's Day and pointed out the fact that violence can arise even from a great love.

The most important values for me personally are based on trust, safety, discretion, professionalism and responsibility, and they form the foundation of help and support offered by Centrum Slniečko.

In the past 21 years, we have evolved significantly, thoughts and ideas have turned into tangible help, through which we are building a comprehensive system of support and protection. Some pieces of the puzzle are still missing, but it is a challenge for us to search for them with the enormous help of our partners, people with big hearts who, in trying to understand the purpose of living in this world, follow this creed: "Why are we here, if not to help the more vulnerable?" The more people like us there are, the happier the others can walk the earth.

Her professional focus is on children's drawing and its use in diagnostics and intervention in children with CAN syndrome. Through the program Bruises on the Soul, she has trained hundreds of teachers, psychologists, social workers, judges, police officers, and students of these fields, in the topic of violence against children.

Victims of Domestic and Gender-Based Violence

Counseling Service for Victims Women's Safe House Safe House shelter Domestic and gender-based violence are terms that carry the weight of many difficult life stories.

Do we know what exactly they mean?

Domestic violence

includes all acts of physical, sexual, psychological, and economic violence that occur within a family or a household. Domestic violence happens between former or current spouses, partners, or other household members.

Gender-based violence

includes all acts of violence aimed against a particular person for their sex, gender, gender identity or gender expression; or acts which disproportionately affect members of one sex.

Expulsion

is an important law enforcement tool helping to stop violence and protect the victim. Officers of the Police Force of the Slovak Republic are authorized to carry out this act. It is a direct assistance for victims in cases where the police state that violence is occurring in the victim's home, therefore the abuser is expelled from the dwelling for 10 days, prohibited from approaching the threatened person, and obliged to remain at a distance of at least 10 meters from the victim. As of 1 November 2021, pursuant to Act No. 171/1993 Coll. on

Police Force, the period of expulsion was changed from 10 days to 14 days, and the distance stated in the restraining order is now extended from 10 meters to 50 meters.



Does assistance for victims exist? Where do they find help?

Although the support network for victims of domestic abuse or gender-based violence in Slovakia is underdeveloped, insufficiently supported by legislature, institutions, and the state as well, it does exist, albeit often just thanks to the effort of individuals. Despite all the obstacles, Centrum Slniečko has been helping victims of domestic and gender-based violence for more than 20 years.

Counseling Service for Victims

It provides social, legal and psychological counseling. Clients are guaranteed anonymity, free of charge services, and gender-sensitive approach to women experiencing violence. We offer professional counseling services through both outpatient and distance forms, as well as in the field.

First contact is established through our Counseling Service for Victims (CSV), usually by phone or email. Assistance can be sought out by the victim, as well as someone who wants to help them to escape a violent relationship. Last, but not least, the victim can be recommended to us by the police, doctors, the Office of Labour, Social Affairs and Family, colleagues, or anyone who is not overlooking violence.

After introductory crisis intervention in a difficult life situation in which the victims find themselves at the time, they are offered complex professional help. Women experiencing violence and victims of domestic abuse carry around a number of problems related to the fact that they lived in a violent relationship. Not only do they need urgent help at the time of their decision to leave the violent relationship, but they also require long-term, highly specialized help, dealing closely with the circumstances of life filled with violence. In this way, the CSV's goal of helping projects itself on to the victims' lives.


CSV is an accredited workplace pursuant to Act No. 274/2017 Coll. on Victims of Crime and on amendments and supplements to certain Acts with the authority in the Nitra Self-Governing Region. It provides social, legal and psychological counseling. Clients are guaranteed anonymity, free of charge services, and gender-sensitive approach to women experiencing violence. We offer professional counseling services through both outpatient and distance forms, as well as in the field.

We provide assistance to vulnerable persons in the context of the act of expulsion. Until 30 October 2021, we provided help to vulnerable persons as per the Cooperation Agreement with the Regional Police Force Directorate in Nitra. We contacted the

victims from expulsion cases proactively and directly, explained the situation and offered free of charge assistance.

As of 1 November 2021, pursuant to the amendment on Act No. 274/2017 Coll. on Victims of Crime, we also opened an intervention center. Members of the police force are obliged to inform the relevant intervention center in each case of expulsion within 24 hours, and the intervention center is obliged to contact the victim of violence within 72 hours. The number of expulsions has increased in the last two months of 2021, and the act of expulsion was used in parts of the Nitra Region, where we have not worked before.

Our assistance for victims of crimes includes active involvement in criminal proceedings through a representative for the injured party, pursuant to Section 53 of the Code of Criminal Procedure; involvement outside of criminal proceedings resulting from expulsion; and legal assistance as well.



Women's Safe House, Safe House shelter

The services of Centrum Slniečko for victims of domestic violence are rooted in complexity. If necessary, women experiencing violence and their children will be offered not only counseling, but also emergency housing as well. We have the Women's Safe House (WSH) available to them. As one of the few facilities in Slovakia, it meets the minimum requirements of the Council of Europe for the provision of services for women experiencing violence and their children. It is 24-hour professional assistance. Women and mothers with children are placed in WSH for the time necessary for crisis intervention. We provide them with protection and support, usually from 3 to 6 months. On top of crisis intervention, our professional team in WSH offers social, psychological and legal counseling, and accompaniment to children and women, as well as services related to education, special education, and psychological care for the children of our clients. A significant part of overcoming trauma is taking part in additional forms of treatment with elements of therapy, such as music therapy, art therapy, ergotherapy, hippotherapy or canine-assisted therapy. After leaving the emergency housing program, our clients still have access to our Counseling Service for Victims.

If women and mothers with children do not require 24-hour services of WSH, but they cannot return to their former home or become fully independent, we can help them find cheaper housing in our Safe House shelter or in other apartments through a housing first program for an agreed upon period, usually one year.

The Safe House shelter (SH) creates a space to become independent and a basis for a successful start of a new life, including entering the labor market and handling the question of accommodation. It provides social services including housing and a system of complex support services aiming to increase motivation and activation of inner potential. Services are temporary until the woman as a victim of violence takes control of her own life and, with the support of a professional team, secures housing for herself and enters the labor market. Throughout the stay in the shelter or an apartment, the Counseling Service is still available to our clients.

All life stories of women experiencing violence and their children are different, so it is possible that

after they complete the complex assistance program, try to become independent and reunite with their families, difficult family situations that put children in danger may arise. In such situations, they have at their disposal the team of the Intervention Center for Families, which focuses on protecting children at risk of CAN syndrome and on helping families in crisis.

In 2021, Counseling Service for Victims, Women's Safe House, and Safe House shelter have been co-financed from the Nitra Self-Governing Region budget, the European Social Fund and the European Regional Development Fund under the Operational Program "Human Resources", subsidies from the Ministry of Justice of the Slovak Republic, public and private grants, and contributions from private donors and supporters.



Families in Crisis

Intervention Center for Families

Intervention Center for Families

Life is full of unpredictable situations which can lead to positive or negative reactions, cause tension, put children in danger or a family in crisis. By crisis, we mean endangerment of an individual or a family by social exclusion or restriction of the ability to integrate into society and deal with problems independently. If an individual or a family find themselves in such a crisis and are unable to help themselves, it is always children who suffer the most. The most ideal situation is when children are growing up in their original family, regardless of its size or structure. It is important to lend a helping hand, in a timely manner, to families facing a crisis of smaller or larger scale, so that we can avoid radical decisions like removal of a child from home.

The Intervention Center for Families (ICF) specializes in assistance to and support of families in crisis and protection of children at risk of CAN syndrome. The term "children at risk of CAN syndrome" refers to children as victims of physical, psychological, and sexual abuse; children suspected to be maltreated or sexually abused; children at risk of maltreatment and sexual

abuse in the future; or children exposed to negative influences, threatening to their mental, physical or social development in family and school environment in connection with violence.

The ICF implements measures under Section 43, para. 1 b) and c) of the Act No. 305/2005 Coll. on Social and Legal Protection of Children and Social Curatorship and on amendments and supplements to certain Acts with nationwide authority.

The goal of the measures the ICF implements is systemic prevention of crisis situations in families, protection of rights and legally protected interests of children, and complex assistance and care for children and families in crisis or risk, in order to prevent deepening and repetition of disorders in psychological, physical and social development of children, thereby preventing an increased number of crisis situations of children or in families.

The pillar of the ICF team's work is a program with a range of specialized sub-programs which we are executed in an outpatient form and through field work in a natural family environment, in an alternative

family care environment, in an open environment, or in an environment created and organized for the implementation of certain measures.

The largest number of families in our care are those recommended through written communication from the authority of social and legal protection of children and social guardianship to implement measures of this institution; but they can also be sent to us from Counseling Service for Victims; or ask for help themselves.

At the center of our work is the assessment of the current situation together, analysis of options, setting of goals and the ways to reach them. Families and individual clients receive social counseling, basic legal counseling, psychological and therapeutic support. We achieve quality and effectivity in our work thanks to the multidisciplinary cooperation across all institutions that intersect with family life and clients – the Office of Labour, Social Affairs and Family, education facilities, health care facilities, Center for Educational and Psychological Counseling and Prevention and many others.

If necessary, we arrange supporting therapies for children, such as canine-assisted therapy, ergotherapy, music therapy or art therapy.

Alternative methods with therapeutic elements are part of implemented measures for clients with various physical, psychological, psychosomatic difficulties, as well as issues with socialization that cause disharmony of their personality.

The duration of assistance and support is individual and depends on the program that is being carried out. On average, it takes from 2 to 12 months.

In 2021, the Intervention Center for Families was co-financed by the Office of Labour, Social Affairs and Family; the Ministry of Labour, Social Affairs and Family of the Slovak Republic; the European Social Fund; the European Regional Development Fund under the Operational Program "Human Resources"; public and private grants and contributions from private donors and supporters.

Intervention Center for Families in numbers

In 2021, ICF provided long-term social counseling and psychological assistance for:

170 individuals, of which 93 were children, assisted mostly directly in clients' family environments.

Maltreated and Sexually Abused Children

Center for Children and Families

Center for Children and Families

In our lives, we see various forms of harm against children. Psychological and physical maltreatment and sexual abuse of children are some of the most severe social and pathological phenomena in our society, as they damage children's physical and psychological development. In Slovakia, only 3 specialized facilities focus solely on assistance to maltreated and sexually abused children. Our Center for Children and Families is one of them.

Center for Children and Families (CCF) is a specialized residential facility designed to help maltreated and sexually abused children, and children who are suspected to be maltreated or sexually abused. It provides complex care for children usually ages 3 to 14 throughout the duration of crisis intervention and for the period of time necessary to assess the options for long-term solutions of the child's situation in accordance with their best interest. CCF is located in two individual houses with yards. Maximum of 10 children can be placed in each house.

Children are admitted to CCF on the basis of a court-ordered urgent or education measure. The reason behind such court orders is improper treatment of children, to which a court is usually notified through the Office of Labour, Social Affairs and Family (OLSAF), which is in turn informed by someone close to the child. CCF's experience shows that children are most often hurt in families, in the exact space where they should be safe. Despite being able to identify some of the risk



factors in families, it is impossible to determine an exact type of family, in which a child can be at risk of maltreatment and sexual abuse, because these unwanted pathological phenomena appear across the whole society.

Handling maltreatment and sexual abuse is difficult and, without an intervention and help from another person, almost impossible for many children. It is rather rare that a child contacts the local OLSAF or CCF directly to ask for assistance. Most of the time, maltreatment of a child is reported by someone close to the child – neighbor, relative, friend, teacher etc.

After being admitted to CCF, children are provided with complex care and support in dealing with the adverse circumstances with respect to their best interest. The child is being cared for by the whole internal team of professionals including a social worker, a psychologist, a special education teacher, educators and assistant educators. The CCF team cooperates with other external professionals – pediatricians, psychiatrists, psychotherapists. It is also important to collaborate with all stakeholders (OLSAF, municipalities, schools, doctors, Center for Educational and Psychological Counseling and Prevention) including law enforcement.

In the first days and weeks of the child's stay, the professional team gives most attention to crisis intervention for the child in a safe environment.



The main areas of focus of our work with maltreated or sexually abused children are:

expression of and coping with negative emotions (sadness, fear, anger, guilt,...)

encouraging healthy self-confidence and self-respect, and recognizing own strengths and weaknesses

preventing CAN syndrome (child rights, response to threatening situations, establishing a support network of trustworthy people)

strengthening social skills (communication, behavior in a group, conflict resolution, managing stressful situations)

teaching to respect of rules and boundaries



Center for Children and Families

Children have a natural need to air out their experien-ces, so they have enough space to talk about their stories and emotions in CCF. We utilize conversations, elements of art therapy, music therapy, Snoezelen therapy and play therapy. Canine-assisted therapy and hippotherapy are among the children's favorites.

Through the whole stay, children have the support of our professional team in legal proceedings as well.

Apart from helping children treated in CCF, expert help is important for the family and close acquaintances. By exposing violence against children, their families are facing shame, rejection, misconception, anger, and even hate from others. Part of the work with families is to explain possible consequences of violence against children and subsequent guidance on how to approach and communicate with them. In cases of severe maltreatment and sexual abuse, crisis intervention and counseling for non-abusive family members (parent, grandparents, siblings) is quite important. Professional assistance is essential particularly

for siblings who are placed in CCF together with the abused child as a result of being in danger, and do not understand why they were removed from the family. These children often react to the maltreated or sexually abused sibling with incomprehension, blame and anger. The stay in CCF is temporary and from the long-term point of view, intense work with close and wider family of the child is necessary to resolve the situation.

Professional work with the family is a necessary condition for remediation and subsequent safe return of the child to the original family environment.

In spite of the efforts of the whole team of professionals, remediation of a maltreated or sexually abused child's family is not always successful, and there may not be any close people who would be able to take care of the child. Taking into consideration the child's age, his or her opinion on solving the situation is asked. If the child is interested, they can be put on the list of children who are in need of alternative personal care. If there is no applicant for alternative care, or the child is refusing this form of care, they are placed into institutional care.

In 2021 Center for Children and Families was cofinanced from the Central Office of Labour, Social Affairs and Family of the Slovak Republic, the Ministry of Labour, Social Affairs and Family of the Slovak Republic, public and private grants, and contributions from private donors and supporters.

Center for Children and Families in numbers

In 2021, CCF provided care to 18 children.

17 children experienced psychological abuse,16 children experienced physical abuse,6 children were victims of sexual abuse,1 child was trafficked (sold as a child bride).

Center for Children and Families in numbers

In 2021 we concluded care in the cases of **7 children**.

Of that number, **4 children** were returned to their biological family after remediation, **1 child** was placed in alternative personal care of a close person and **2 children** were placed in institutional care.

Prevention and Education Center EduCAN

Prevention and Education Center EduCAN

More than 20 years of working with victims of domestic violence have unequivocally proven to us that minimizing and preventing violence is possible only through education and prevention, which is why Centrum Slniečko has been engaging in those systematically for a long time. Prevention and Education Center EduCAN offers various education programs for experts in various fields. In 2021, our trainings were attended by almost 1,000 people, including professionals and future professionals (university students) from different fields (social work,

pedagogy, law, police, counseling etc.). We organize many prevention and information activities for the general public. What attracted the most attention in the previous year was what we called "a different kind of" campaign on Valentine's Day which was presented online as well as through city light boards in 3 regional seats (Bratislava, Nitra, Trnava).



The pillars of our education and prevention activities:

Trainings for professionals from kindergartens and elementary schools through **Kozmo and his Adventures**, a prevention program for children.

Trainings for experts working with children through the educational program **Bruises on the Soul.**

Education and awareness campaigns for the professional and the general public.

In 2021, Prevention and Education Center EduCAN was co-financed from the Velux Foundation, public and private grants and contributions from private donors and supporters.

Kozmo and his Adventures



In 2021 we managed to increase the quality of our education programs and make our tools more appealing. A significant part of each module of the prevention program Kozmo and his Adventures is a video introduction to the topic. The original videos had been produced more than 5 years ago, but in the present day, they were unfit for our needs relating to younger children. We have updated the videos in 2021 and created new and longer versions for the youngest children.

In addition to materials for children, we have designed new training structures for teachers. The goal of our 10 educational videos presenting the implementation of individual modules of the prevention program Kozmo and his Adventures is to show how to work with the program, methodology and tools, when working directly with children. However, in the training, we are presenting the modules to adults, and it is not possible to do a session where participants could try to work directly with children. For this reason, we had decided to produce these methodological videos, which provide the experience through audiovisual recording.

Another innovation from the previous year is a special version of the program for families, called Kozmo at Home. Under this new project, Kozmo is coming to families. It is a program designed for parents, grandparents, siblings and other adults, with the help of which they can talk to children about challenging topics in the form of games and activities. The program contains a review of methodology for adults full of inspiring activities, as well as a set of interactive tools and online education (webinar).

We have developed an original board game called Space Journey based on the prevention program Kozmo and his Adventures. The game is aimed at children from 5 years of age, and is quite unique, because nobody ever loses. The goal of the game is to collaborate, solve tasks together and appreciate positive character features of others.

In terms of social media, we managed to organically gain support for our program's Instagram profile from many well-known Slovak female influencers, including Jasmína Alagič, Silvia Križanová or Zuzana Plačková, who shared our activities free of charge and without any impulse from our side.



Kozmo and his Adventures in numbers



In 2021, through the prevention program Kozmo and his Adventures

went through supervision to implement activities of the prevention program. The program was implemented in 72 kindergartens and elementary schools, with 102 groups of 1,279 children in total. Our specialized program Kozmo at Home was taken up by 742 parents.

No Bruises

Prevention, education and information campaigns



In 2021, we premiered 20 episodes of our podcast called No Bruises, which had 6,149 listens in total. Among the topics which resonated the most was divorce, how children handle the process of divorce, and child victims of cyberbullying. The most listened to topics on our podcast are interviews dealing with children, which vindicates our systematic effort to develop prevention projects, as well as the existence of the Kozmo and his Adventures program. Currently, the overall number of listens of the podcast No Bruises is on average 250 per episode. In September, we launched an online campaign for the new season.

We managed to shape our Instagram account @ bezmodrin into a successful educational platform followed by people interested in human rights, and especially in helping people who experience violence. We realize that the recognition of our "brand" Centrum Slniečko is not as important to the general public, but it is necessary for people seeking help. That is why we came up with a new format for communication on Instagram, new title and design, thanks to which we can successfully attract and educate an entirely new audience about this topic.

As part of the No Bruises platform, the website www.bezmodrin.sk has become an information channel and source for all kinds of news related to legal acts on the protection of human rights. We regularly share new information, current events and interviews with interesting people on our website. In 2021, the overall traffic on bezmodrin.sk was around 8,500 clicks.

In February, we launched a special Valentine's Day campaign online as well as through city light billboards in three regional seats, drawing attention to the presence of domestic violence and violence in romantic relationships, during the critical time for all the "lovebirds". Throughout 2021, we made the topic of protection against violence visible in more than 300 media appearances through interviews, articles and press releases. As part of our activities, we organized many trainings for lawyers, social workers, teachers and students through our popular formats Bruises on the Soul focused on different forms of violence, identification of its signs, and recommendations on how to proceed in these situations.

Education through Bruises on the Soul

In 2021, through our education program Bruises on the Soul, we trained **656 lawyers, social workers,** and **teachers** with experience as well as future professionals from the ranks of **students** from around Slovakia.

Drum Session

Prevention, education and information campaigns

Drum Session is our regular fall event. In addition to many Slovak kindergartens, elementary schools and other entities, various organizations and institutions from Czech Republic participated in the event on 19 November 2021. For the first time ever, we managed to organize an event with international reach. Despite the unusual pandemic situation, more than 50,000 children and adults in more than 430 schools, organizations, foundations and companies were beating the drums across all of Slovakia and Czechia, from Sokolovo to Veľké Kapušany. Schools, organizations, communities, companies, banks, foundations, the Band of the Castle Guards and the Police of the Czech Republic, as well as the Police of the Slovak Republic all took part. All of them were beating the drums in the name of the central idea of the event: silence cannot protect children from violence!

The 8th year of the nationwide drum session called "We beat the drums so that children can be heard more 2021" was held under the auspices of the President of the Slovak Republic, Zuzana Čaputová. Among the organizers of the Drum Session were Centrum Slniečko, n. o., National Coordination Centre for Resolving the Issues of Violence against Children, and Centrum LOCIKA, z. ú., Praha.

Lobbying – Partnerships

In Centrum Slniečko we are truly excited to have been working for years now with active investigators, with whom we meet each quarter to work out common solutions and suggestions. Those include the intervention centers, or a legislative proposal prepared this year, that would introduce a new crime connected to domestic violence.

The meetings of representatives of various organizations active in the issue of violence and devising the Strategy focused on domestic violence

elimination, which was approved by the Nitra Self-Governing Region (NSR) were also quite important. This is the first adopted strategy aimed at domestic violence elimination during the term of NSR. Part of the strategy is training of professionals and future professionals, and cooperation, prevention and support of services for victims of domestic violence. NSR is currently the only self-governing region in Slovakia which supports women's shelter on Slovak territory to the fullest extent possible and accepts 24-hour nonstop expert social services. Thanks to the active effort of the Social Committee, the contribution for the advisor on services for families was successfully increased.

At the city level, Centrum Slniečko was actively involved in the conception of a community plan for Nitra that would take into consideration the experience and requirements from the field in the context of assistance to victims of domestic violence. The community plan includes increasing the number of facilities for victims of domestic violence to at least 7, as well as many other key goals strengthening prevention and counseling services for victims of domestic violence. In cooperation with the STORM organization, we put together the Strategy for Risk Behavior Solutions Focused on the Issues of Drug Use and Elimination of Domestic Violence, Violence Against Women and Children which was approved by the City Council of Nitra. The final strategy includes important education and prevention programs Kozmo and his Adventures, Kozmo at Home. Bruises on the Soul and others.

At the national level under the auspices of the President Zuzana Čaputová, we successfully pushed through the inclusion of intervention centers into the Act No. 274/2017 Coll. on Victims of Crime, thereby legislatively covering the cooperation of counseling

centers with the police in the context of the act of expulsion. It is significant that the ministry set aside financial resources for the operation of at least one intervention center in the region.

In 2021, we have strengthened existing partnerships and established new ones with universities, where we trained many students and teachers on the issue of maltreated and sexually abused children, appropriate and inappropriate approach to the issue, and elimination of secondary victimization. This includes the Faculty of Law and the Faculty of Health Sciences and Social Work at Trnava University, and the Faculty of Social Sciences and Health Care at Constantine the Philosopher University in Nitra.

We have also cooperated at expert level with the Ministry of Education of the Slovak Republic in commenting on the new curriculum proposal aimed at inclusive education and at promoting prevention, as well as prevention and education programs for teaching and professional staff, specifically in the topic of violence against and among children. Many of our comments have been taken into consideration.

Our expert potential has also been utilized in the expert team at the Ministry of Labour, Social Affairs and Family of the Slovak Republic focused on specialized training sessions, for example on the issue of CAN syndrome. At the end of the year, we were part of the evaluation of the new curriculum proposal, specifically for social work studies and the fulfillment of quality criteria for accreditation of social work studies at Constantine the Philosopher University in Nitra. Our director, Mariana Kováčová, was part of the evaluation team.

Just as in 2020, COVID was not exactly inviting to direct volunteer activities in 2021 either. In spite of this, the year 2021 has seen 582 hours of direct help of 4 volunteers with various activities of our organization. 
