Director's Foreword

Summing up the year 2022 is not an easy task. Even in looking back, the events that took place still feel fresh and leave their mark all around us. The beginning of the year brought us some relief, as the number of Covid-19 deaths dropped significantly, but all hope for a better year was crushed on 24 February 2022 with the news of Russia invading Ukraine. It took me by surprise, just as it did most reasonable people. I could not comprehend that innocent children, women, elderly and sick people as well as men, fathers, grandfathers, and sons were being killed so close to us, just a few kilometers from our border. War in the 21st century. This close to us.

I have been dealing with the issue of violence against children, women, and vulnerable groups for more than 30 years. Together with the whole team of Centrum Slniečko, we are trying to protect hundreds of victims of domestic abuse from violence and its continuation; to offer help in overcoming the trauma caused by violence. It is not simple, because sometimes we just do not have the capacity anymore. We are just humans, not machines.

The year 2022 has brought cases of traumatized children, women, mothers, grandmothers who fled to safety from the war in Ukraine. The initial days of the war, when thousands of people started fleeing, we, as a team of Centrum Slniečko, raised money to help women and especially children and sent material aid based on appeals of our fellow organizations. After the first wave of mostly mothers with children, we offered them housing in the free capacities of our facilities, we secured everything they needed, and were ready to admit children themselves. Aware of the desperate situation of incoming refugees from Ukraine, we selected two social workers to help in the COMIN community center near Nitra with counseling, accompanying, and assisting the children. We did not wait for instructions. Crisis situations require crisis solutions. On one hand, it was amazing to watch the strength we can generate to help those in need and how we can cooperate. On the other hand, I saw how much our state is failing. How late its response is, how it fails to secure help and protection because of various barriers. How afraid the individual parts of the "machine" are to make a decision in crisis situations just to avoid breaking the letter of the law, to not do anything or issue a decision that could be

challenged later. Fortunately, by the time help from the state came, the civil society had managed to mobilize immediately. It waited neither for decisions, financial aid, nor any promises. Some rushed to the border, others helped inside the country. This war and its consequences have been haunting us for the whole year. And they still are.

Our work in Centrum Slniečko, aimed at helping maltreated, sexually abused children, victims of domestic violence, and families in crisis has not been limited in any way. Apart from the housing centers for children, women, and mothers with children, we ran the Victim Counseling Center along with a long dreamt-of Intervention Center that strengthened our cooperation with the police in helping the victims of domestic violence, specifically in cases of expulsion of a violent person from common dwelling. The help provided to families in crisis, where violence against children often occurs in multiple forms, and which is carried out by the Intervention Center for Families team, was also significant. A new service of ours was the assistance to women and mothers with children through securing rental housing with housing first elements. We had 9 apartments available. None of

this would have been possible without prevention and education. We realize that it is essential to pass on everything we learn in everyday practice, both through distance learning or face-to-face, whether it be through the prevention program Kozmo and his Adventures, articles, campaigns, podcasts, or educational formats such as Bruises on the Soul.

It could not have been done without our allies, supporters, or teamwork either. A huge THANK YOU goes out to the whole team of Centrum Slniečko, which never gives up and always takes on the "difficult challenges". We are grateful for all supporters, donors, state institutions, self-governing regions, each and every person, small businesses and huge corporations, all of those, who help in any way where it is needed. "What man is a man who does not make the world better?"

Mariana Kováčová graduated from special education studies and has been dealing with the issue of maltreated and sexually abused children, women experiencing violence, and victims of domestic violence since 1990. In 2000, she founded and has since been running a non-profit organization called Centrum Slniečko. She initiated the establishment of specialized centers for maltreated and sexually abused children, children's hotlines, and the

first women's shelter in Slovakia. She is an expert guarantor and author of projects focused on systematic schemes of effective assistance for children with CAN syndrome, families in crisis, and victims of domestic violence. For more than 20 years, she has been involved in supervision in social area, devising standards and education. Her professional focus is on children's drawing and its use in diagnostics and intervention in children with CAN syndrome. Through the program Bruises on the Soul, she has trained hundreds of teachers, psychologists, social workers, judges, police officers, and students of these fields, in the topic

of violence against children. Maltreated and sexually abused children

Center for Children and Families (CCF)

Center for Children and Families (CCF)

Psychological and physical maltreatment and sexual abuse are among the most serious socio-pathological phenomena in our society. They represent a severe threat for children as they often lead to the disruption of a child's healthy physical, psychological, and social development. To avoid serious harm to in these areas, it is critical to provide the child with timely professional help. In Slovakia, there are only three specialized facilities aimed at helping maltreated and sexually abused children. One of them is the Center for Children and Families (CCF) run by Centrum Slniečko, n.o.

Due to the degree of difficulty and sensitivity of resolving the situation of a maltreated and sexually abused child, intervention and help from others is crucial. It is rather rare that the child asks the Office of Labour, Social Affairs and Family (OLSAF), or the CCF for help directly. The OLSAF is usually notified of maltreatment of a child by someone close to the child, for instance a relative, friend, teacher etc. Through the OLSAF, the court is informed of the situation and assesses the severity of the abuse, possible solutions for the situation and, if necessary, orders an urgent or re-educational measure, based on which the child may be admitted to the CCF.

The CCF is a residential facility with a specialized program focused on helping maltreated and sexually abused children and children who are seriously suspected of having been maltreated or sexually abused. The goal of the measures of Social and Legal Protection of Children and Social Curatorship

implemented in the CCF is the systematic prevention of potential crisis situations in families; the protection of children's rights and interests protected by law; and complex assistance and care for maltreated and sexually abused children in order to prevent the deepening and recurrence of disorders in children's psychological, physical and social development, which in turn prevents the increase of socio-pathological phenomena in the society. Children in the care of the CCF are mostly 3 to 14 years of age.

The CCF owns two individual family houses with backyards. Each can accommodate a maximum of ten children. Children are provided with complex care and support, including psychological care with an emphasis on their best interests. To help the children cope with the crisis situation and stabilize them, we use elements of canine-assisted therapy, hippotherapy, Snoezelen therapy, music therapy as well as art therapy.



When violence against a child is exposed, the wider community around the family often reacts with a lack of understanding, anger or even hatred. Therefore, in addition to assisting the child placed in the CCF, it is necessary to provide professional help to siblings, family members, and others close to the child. As part of the professional work with the family, there is a need to point out possible consequences of violence against children and guide others on how to communicate with the child. Family members not involved in the maltreatment or abuse of the child (parent, grandparents, siblings) should undergo individual crisis intervention and counseling. It is crucial to pay attention to siblings as well. The child's stay in the CCF is temporary and intense work with the child's immediate and extended family is required to address the situation in the long term. It is necessary to realize that professional intervention is an essential step for the rehabilitation of the

family and the child's return to a safe, original family environment or for the placement into the extended family.

Taking care of children in the CCF is a team effort which includes a social worker, psychologist, special education teacher, educators and assistant educators, as well as administrative staff. In dealing with the child's situation, the professional team cooperates with other external professionals, such as a pediatrician, psychiatrist, therapist, etc. It is also important to cooperate with other stakeholders, such as the OLSAF, municipality, school, doctor, Center for Educational and Psychological Counseling and Prevention, and law enforcement authorities.

In 2022, the CCF provided care to 21 children on the basis of a court-ordered urgent or re-educational measure. Only rarely is a child victim to just one form of



violence, most often it is a different combination of various forms. After leaving our care, it is important to secure a safe environment for the child, with no maltreatment or abuse present. For safety reasons, family rehabilitation was not possible in the cases of seven children, nor was it possible to place them in foster care. Therefore, after crisis intervention and care in the CCF was completed, the court ordered the children to be put in institutional care. Three children were placed in the foster care of their grandparents and two children have returned to their biological family after remediation.

In 2022 Center for Children and Families was cofinanced from the Central Office of Labour, Social Affairs and Family of the Slovak Republic, the Ministry of Labour, Social Affairs and Family of the Slovak Republic, public and private grants, and contributions from private donors and supporters

Intervention Center for Families (ICF)



Family is the basic unit of society, created in society, and connected to society. It is the first social group of which one is a member. A person's whole life is connected to and influenced by this group.

Life brings unforeseen circumstances which can cause tension, pose a threat to children, or put the family into crisis. The children themselves can also be at risk of neglect, maltreatment, sexual abuse or domestic violence. That is why the Intervention Center for Families (ICF) was founded.

The ICF focuses on implementing measures through outpatient care and field work to protect children at risk of CAN syndrome (acronym for child abuse and neglect syndrome), and on helping families in crisis. The ICF covers field work and the outpatient care portion of the CCF with nationwide authority under Section 45, para. 1 b) and c) of the Act No. 305/2005 Coll. through specialized sub-programs; and the implementation of measures of the authority of Social and Legal Protection of Children and Social Curatorship (SLPC & SC) pursuant to Section 88, para. 1 of the Act No. 305/2005 Coll. within the Nitra Self-Governing Region. The duration of assistance and support varies from person to person.

Measures carried out by the ICF expert team are aimed at the systematic prevention of crisis situations in the family. They reduce and eliminate negative influences which endanger the psychological, physical, or social development of a child or an adult natural person through multidisciplinary diagnostics and team planning of measures of the authority of SLPC & SC, measures of the authority of Social and Legal Protection of Children (SLPC), and selected educational and social programs.

The ICF expert team offers free social counseling and basic legal counseling to clients in crisis and arranges psychological help or therapy. If necessary and suitable, they organize various complementary types of therapy for children (canine-assisted therapy, ergotherapy, music therapy or art therapy) which represent a successful method for psychological relief and help with socialization by helping overcome different types of psychological issues.

No family lives in a vacuum, it is usually a part of a wider community, which is why the most effective help only works thanks to the multidisciplinary cooperation with its wider environment – educational or medical facilities, regional Offices of Labour, Social Affairs and Family (OLSAF), municipal and regional institutions, courts, Centers for Educational and Psychological Counseling and Prevention, and other related organizations.

The most common way of beginning work with a family is a written recommendation from the SLPC & SC authority for the implementation of the SLPC & SC measures. These are families that have been monitored by the OLSAF for various reasons and

require additional support or a special form of assistance. Oftentimes, we also come in contact with families who are not being monitored by any of the OLSAFs, but have gotten into a situation they cannot resolve on their own. In such a case, they ask for help themselves by contacting the ICF by phone or email, or they are referred to the ICF from the Center for Victims of Domestic Violence or Center for Children and Families.

After the Russian military attack against Ukraine on 24 February 2022 and the beginning of the influx of refugees, we provided assistance and support for the contact point, created by the city of Nitra, through two of our experts, which consisted mostly of social counseling, arranging therapeutic help or assistance in various practical errands such as help with transportation, babysitting, arranging accommodation, or necessary legal documents, etc.

Our donors and supporters are an inseparable component of helping families in crisis. Thanks to their support, the families in the ICF's care had the opportunity to take a trip to a waterpark, experience cultural events, enjoy gift bags on Saint Nicholas

Day and unwrap gifts underneath the Christmas tree, as well as stock up on basic groceries, sanitary and cleaning supplies, household goods, or even toys, books and school supplies for children.

In 2022, the Intervention Center for Families was co-financed by the Office of Labour, Social Affairs and Family; the Ministry of Labour, Social Affairs and Family of the Slovak Republic; the European Social Fund; the European Regional Development Fund under the Operational Program "Human Resources"; public and private grants and contributions from private donors and supporters

Center for Victims of Domestic Violence (CVDV)



The Center for Victims of Domestic Violence (CVDV) is a complex of specialized services designed for professional assistance for women experiencing intimate partner violence and victims of domestic violence. Integral parts of this comprehensive professional assistance center include:

Victim Counseling Center and Intervention Center (VCC & IC)

Women's Safe House (WSH)

Safe House shelter (SH)

Housing First program (HF)

Victim Counseling Center and Intervention Center (VCC & IC)

The comprehensive assistance in the CVDV begins with the first contact in the **Victim Counseling Center and Intervention Center (VCC & IC)**. After the initial crisis intervention, victims of violence are provided with complex professional help through outpatient and distance form of care and field work. Social, legal, and psychological counseling is provided. Victims of crime are also assisted by active involvement in criminal proceedings through a representative for the injured party pursuant to Section 53 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, or alternatively through an accompanying person pursuant to Section 48a of the Code of Criminal Procedure; by intervention outside of criminal proceedings resulting from expulsion; and by legal assistance.

The VCC & IC is an accredited workplace pursuant to Act No. 274/2017 Coll. on Victims of Crime and on amendments and supplements to certain Acts as an intervention center with the authority in the Nitra Self-Governing Region and as of 2022 also in the districts of Dunajská Streda, Galanta, and Hlohovec of the Trnava Self-Governing Region.

The essence of the work in the IC lies in providing assistance to persons at risk following the implementation of the expulsion measure by the police officers. Members of the Police Force who enforce the expulsion measure are obliged to inform the relevant intervention center about each case of expulsion within 24 hours and the intervention center is required to contact the person at risk within 72 hours. In 2022, there were 86 expulsion cases in the Nitra Self-Governing Region and 5 in the Trnava Self-Governing Region where the intervention centers took the persons at risk in their care after being notified. Apart from the persons at risk after carrying out the expulsion measure, assistance is provided continuously to the victims of violence as part of crisis intervention.

Women's Safe House

A follow-up service of the VCC & IC is immediate crisis accommodation in the **Women's Safe House (WSH)**. The WSH is a place which offers help to women and children who have been exposed to violence. The WSH with the capacity of maximum 17 people aids women experiencing violence and mothers with children who have been exposed to violence or witnessed a violent relationship between their parents.

Victims of domestic violence in the WSH get housing, crisis intervention, psychological, social, and basic legal counseling, social assistance and help, accompaniment, prevention as well as additional forms of therapy – music therapy, art therapy, ergotherapy, movement therapy, activities with therapeutic elements (parenting skills development, financial literacy and special skills training – computer skills, preparation for entry into the job market, preparation for education). Women and children in the WSH are also given space for free time activities such as short hikes or trips to the nearby area, naturally, with their safety in mind.



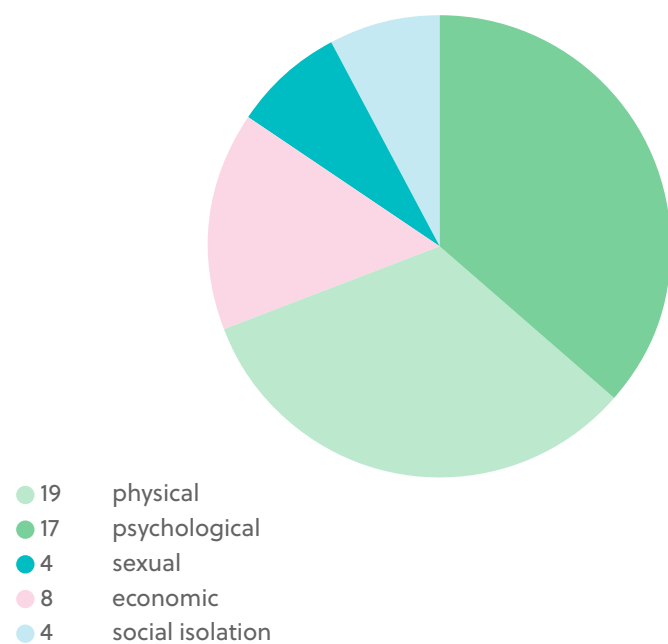

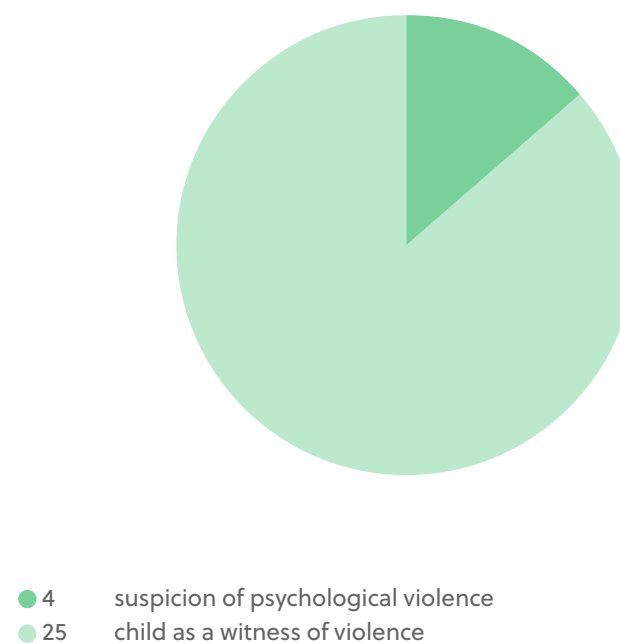

If women and mothers with children in the WSH do not require 24-hour services of the WSH, but cannot return to their previous home or become independent, we can offer them housing in the **Safe House shelter** or in apartments through the **Housing First program** for a fixed period of time, usually one year.

Safe House shelter

The Safe House shelter with capacity for 7 people serves as a space for clients to become independent and restart their life successfully, finding work and solving the housing issue. It provides social services including accommodation and a system of complex support services boosting motivation and activation of inner potential. The services are temporary until the woman – victim of abuse – is able to regain control of her life and, with the support of our professional team, secure housing and enter the job market. While staying in the shelter or the apartments, women still have access to services of the VCC & IC.

In September 2022, the activities of the shelter were halted due to the renovation works in cooperation with the city of Nitra. The plan is to transform the shelter to a Women's Safe House. After the remodeling is finished, the building, with the capacity for 15 people, will serve as an extension of the current WSH, making it available to 32 people altogether.

After the Russian military attack against Ukraine on 24 February 2022 and the initial influx of refugees, we provided temporary housing to **4 women with 5 children** in the Safe House shelter. **One woman with two children** subsequently applied for housing through the Housing First program and **3 women with 3 children** have secured new housing with help of their acquaintances.

The Housing First program

Part of the CVDV's complex of services is the **Housing First program** – affordable rental housing for victims of domestic violence and women experiencing violence along with their children after undergoing crisis intervention in apartments for a fixed period. In 2022, thanks to project support, we managed to expand the number of available 1- and 2-bedroom apartments which meant offering housing for 11 women and 19 children aged 3 to 17. Of them, 6 mothers with 10 children have moved into the apartments after crisis intervention in the WSH or the Safe House shelter, 3 mothers with 6 children were put up there immediately after being admitted to the VCC, and 2 mothers with 3 children were provided with public housing on the basis of measures implemented through the ICF's field social work. One of the apartments served as temporary housing for a victim of war – a Ukrainian mother with 2 children. The program also includes free social counseling, accompaniment and support activities for women/mothers and children through outpatient care or field work.

Victims of domestic abuse need comprehensive and all-round assistance specifically suited for their



individual issues. In most of the cases, it is not just one-time counseling, but long-term systematic work that may often take several years. Victims of domestic abuse begin counseling with a slew of issues that they try to solve together with the workers in ways that affect their lives in the most comprehensive way. The interconnected complex of CVDV's services provided not only by VCC & IC, but also the subsequent work in the WSH or the HF program, contributes to the effective work with victims of violence.

Victims of domestic abuse need comprehensive and all-round assistance specifically suited for their individual issues. In most of the cases, it is not just one-time counseling, but long-term systematic work that may often take several years.

CVDV and collaborations

In 2022, CVDV has been further expanding its long-term cooperation with the **Regional Police Force Directorate in Nitra** in the form of trainings and three meetings of the working group focused on the issue of domestic violence against children. Thanks to this long-standing cooperation, the pilot project of the IC has been translated to the Act No. 274/2017 Coll. on Victims of Crime, and in 2022, the Ministry of Justice of the Slovak Republic established intervention centers for victims in each self-governing region in Slovakia. The working group was formalized and approved by the leadership of the Regional Police Force Directorate in Nitra in 2022. As part of this cooperation, real case studies are being resolved by seeking the most suitable solutions and through this activity, we are perfecting the way of collaboration between the IC and individual police departments. In 2022, the output of our working group was the suggestion of a definition of a new criminal offence of "domestic violence". The **Information Office for Victims of Crimes Nitra** also joined the initiative of incorporating the criminal offence in question into legislation by turning to relevant ministries with the same proposal.

Regular work meetings with the leadership of the Slovak Police Force took place as part of collaboration with the **Coordinating-Methodical Centre for Gender-Based and Domestic Violence**. They addressed the suggestions from the intervention centers regarding the application of the amendment on victims of crime and the amendment on the police force in connection with the expulsion measure implementation by police officers. The working group involved other organizations working with victims of violence as well. In cooperation with the Coordinating-Methodical Center, a work meeting of the platform participating in the preparation of the Regional Action Plan of Prevention and Elimination of Violence Against Women under the authority of the Nitra Self-Governing Region took place. Centrum Slniečko joined the campaign organized by the Coordinating-Methodical Center called "Let's End Violence Against Women 2022".

Thanks to the support of our partners and donors, women and children in CVDV's care had the opportunity to take a trip to a waterpark, experience cultural events, enjoy gift bags on Saint Nicholas Day and unwrap gifts under the Christmas tree, stock up

on basic groceries, sanitary and cleaning supplies, household goods, even toys, books and school supplies for children. Thanks to the support of the SLSP Foundation and other donors, we were able to furnish the apartments in the Housing First program according to the individual needs of women and children and turn them into pleasant spaces.

In 2022, Center for Victims of Domestic Violence has been co-financed from the Nitra Self-Governing Region budget, the European Social Fund and the European Regional Development Fund under the Operational Program "Human Resources", subsidies from the Ministry of Justice of the Slovak Republic, public and private grants, and contributions from private donors and supporters.



Prevention, education, awareness

Prevention and Education Center EduCAN –
center of Education and Prevention

EduCAN – center of Education and Prevention

More than 20 years of work with victims of domestic violence unequivocally confirms that minimizing and preventing violence is possible only through educational and prevention activities, which is why Centrum Slniečko has been pursuing these systematically and for a long time. Prevention and Education Center EduCAN offers many educational programs for experts of different fields and is active in raising awareness in topics aimed at the elimination and prevention of violence.

In 2022, Prevention and Education Center EduCAN was co-financed from the Velux Foundation, Ministry of Justice of the Slovak Republic, public and private grants and contributions from private donors and supporters.

The main pillars of our education and prevention activities are:

Kozmo and his Adventures

education for professionals from kindergartens and elementary schools through a prevention program for children; education of parents; additional KOZMO activities



Bruises on the Soul

education of professionals working with children through training

educational awareness-raising and information campaigns for the expert community and general public

Kozmo and his Adventures

The pandemic has shown us that a modern webinar in the form of a course has great potential. In February 2022, we finished the transformation of education in the prevention program Kozmo and his Adventures into this very format, which was subsequently launched. In addition to theoretical concepts, the webinar includes real work with the prevention program, methodology and tools directly used on children in kindergartens.

In 2022, we released a music album with 8 original songs. We composed them with the help of Julián Ratica, a musician known under the pseudonym Pánko, who is also the writer of Kozmo and his Adventures theme song. Song lyrics were consulted with experts who put the songs to the test from the professional standpoint as well as with children in practice. The creative process was approached as empirical research reflecting the style and ability to understand of a group of children under the age of 8. The CD also includes an electronic booklet with lyrics. Both parents and experts working with children can download it to their mobile devices, tablets, computers, or print out a required number of copies. The booklet contains a coloring book to enhance the

experience. Songs that children like are part of the modules of the prevention program and have been added to Spotify, where people can listen to them for free.

We added music videos as a bonus to the music album. We produced 8 tasteful, child-friendly original animated videos with a lyrical component helping families and groups in facilities for children remember the lyrics and sing them together.

In 2022, we also continued to distribute the specialized program Kozmo at Home I., Kozmo at Home II., as well as additional educational and awareness-raising products from the Kozmo line, such as Space Game, a book with a guide encouraging cooperation, as the only way to win is that all participants do so together.

In the first quarter of 2022, we launched a new website www.kozmove-dobrodruzstva.sk. This is the fourth version of this website, but updates are necessary for two main reasons:

1) Technology and new standards in web development are advancing quickly. Kozmo has a history and if it is going to be a current project, its



website always has to be updated and modern.

2) Since its inception, especially in the past two years, the project has grown along with its new products. The old interface did not allow a fully-fledged and sufficient format for communicating the new services and products.

In addition to the new UX and web design, the new site brings a new structure that helps individual target groups find information easier. We added a blog section where our experts from Centrum Slniečko contribute regularly. Our audience wishes to stay in touch and appreciates information straight from the experts.

Kozmo and his Adventures in numbers

In 2022, we managed to:

train 82 experts through the prevention program Kozmo and his Adventures and implemented it in **73 kindergartens and elementary schools** with more than **120 groups** and a total number of **3,200 participating children.**



Bruises on the Soul

Experiential innovative trainings where participants use their acquired skills in practice were completed a total of 346 professionals and future professionals in 2022. This included psychologists, social workers, police officers, teachers, and students. The topics covered included the CAN syndrome, domestic and gender-based violence, and multidisciplinary cooperation.

Three e-learning courses are also a part of the Bruises on the Soul trainings. In 2022, they were attended by 295 people. We also reworked the trainings Bruises on the Soul into an online format and the full version will be launched in 2023.

prevention, education, and information campaigns

As part of our communication strategy, we focused on the fall season and through 16 days of activism, we published a series of educational Instagram posts and bezmodrin.sk website articles. The series entitled "First Aid" summarized useful information and answers to the most common questions which women experiencing domestic violence seek. The posts' reach surpassed our expectations and many of them were spontaneously shared by different Slovak influencers.

In 2022, we premiered 20 new episodes of our No Bruises podcast, which had 5,761 listeners in total through streaming services (4,883) and YouTube (878), an average of 288 listens per episode. We shared 57 news articles on our website www.bezmodrin.sk and the traffic in 2022 was almost 6,000 clicks, which means the average monthly traffic of 500 clicks. Active awareness raising about prevention was promoted through our Instagram account @kozmonaut_kozmo where we shared 106 posts in the newsfeed, many of them multiposts, alongside innumerable content in Instagram stories. In 2022, our Instagram account reached 1,426 followers.

Drum Session

Our biggest awareness-raising and information event is the **Drum Session**. On Friday, 18 November 2022, the largest ever meeting of children standing up for their right in Slovak and Czech history so far took place. Nearly 89,000 children and adults throughout Slovakia and Czechia proved that **CHILDREN'S VOICES ARE IMPORTANT!** The ninth volume of Slovak and Czech common drum session called **"Drumming to make children's voices heard 2022!"** were held under the auspices of Zuzana Čaputová, the President of the Slovak Republic, and Klára Laurenčíková, the Government Commissioner of Human Rights under the Government of the Czech Republic.

Schools, organizations, communities as well as cities, companies, banks, foundations, and even the Police of the Czech Republic and the Police of the Slovak Republic all joined, from Aš to Čierne Pole. Drumming was also heard in the Presidential Palace where the President of the Slovak Republic Zuzana

Čaputová beat the drums together with children from Elementary School Ostredková Bratislava and the Campana Batucada group, which has been accompanying this event in Nitra since its first edition in 2014. The drumming itself was a culmination of a range of supporting activities like discussions, workshops, drawing competitions, or lectures on the topic of protecting children from violence and violence prevention as such.

Throughout 2022, there were 82 media appearances on the topic of protection against violence and prevention, both through interviews and reporting. Of them, 16 focused on specific topics, and 46 in Slovakia and 20 in Czechia related to the Drum Session 2022.

The co-organizers of the Drum Session included the National Coordination Centre for Resolving the Issues of Violence against Children, and Centrum LOCIKA, z. ú., Praha.

Volunteering and collections

In 2022, volunteers were once again a huge help for us and our work, not only with 171.5 collective hours of direct volunteering, but also through financial collections, material aid collections, and assistance.

The care of our volunteers from Karcher and their equipment brightened one of our houses and when they donated one of their superior machines to us, our eyes brightened as well. In our line of work, our team can find itself in tense or

dangerous situations that require both communication skills and sometimes even physical defense techniques to eliminate the threat. In 2022, Mr. Juraj from Providentia gave several lessons to us.

In 2022, material aid collections to support women and children in the care of the ICF, the WSH, and the VCC & IC were organized by Slovak Catholic Diaconia, section of the Slovak Old-Catholic Church; civic association Lexras; students from the Faculty of Economics and Management of the SUA in Nitra; employees of Constantine the Philosopher University in Nitra; pupils and parents from the Elementary School Oponice; employees of Liquibox Nitra and Kardiocentrum Nitra. 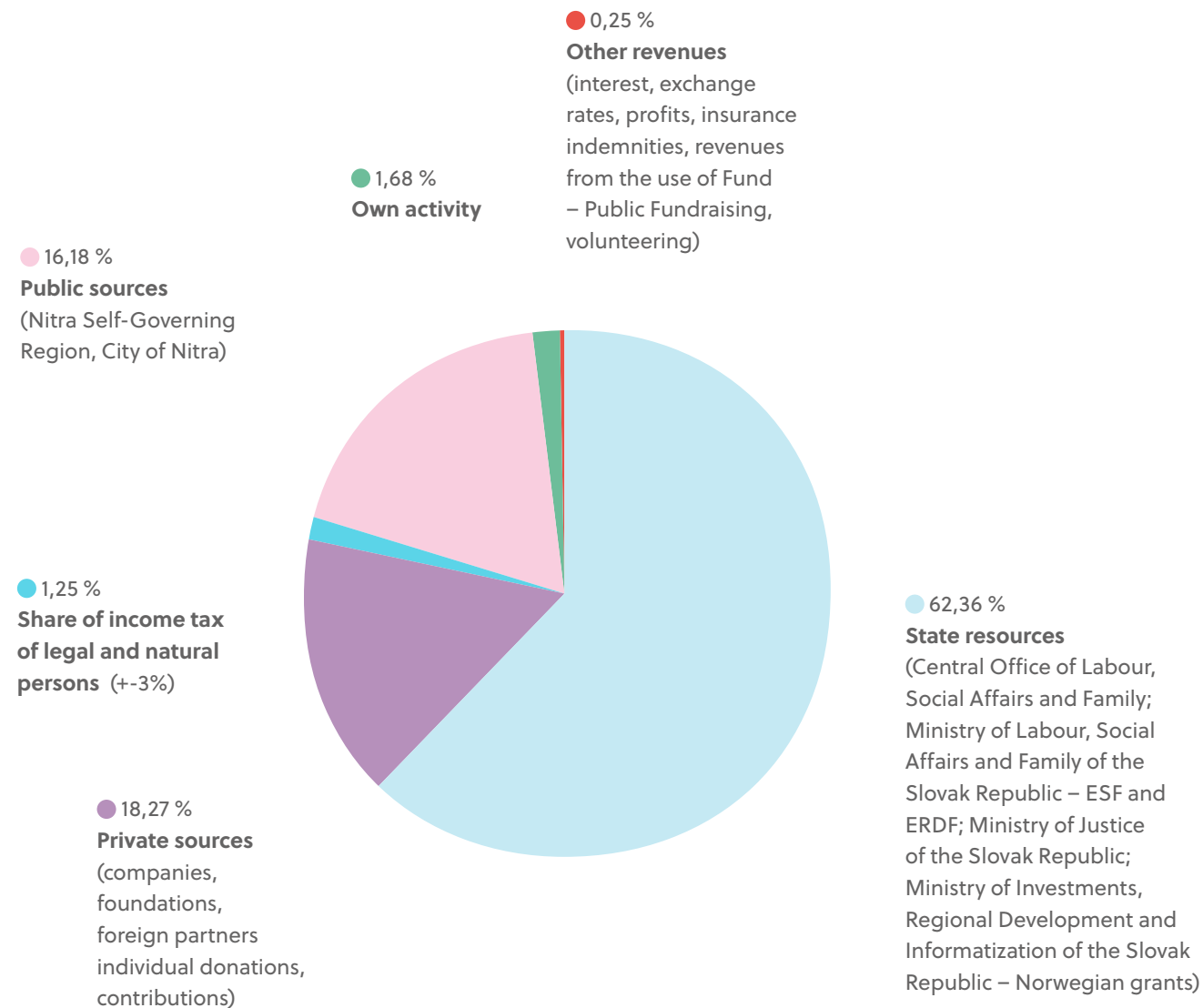

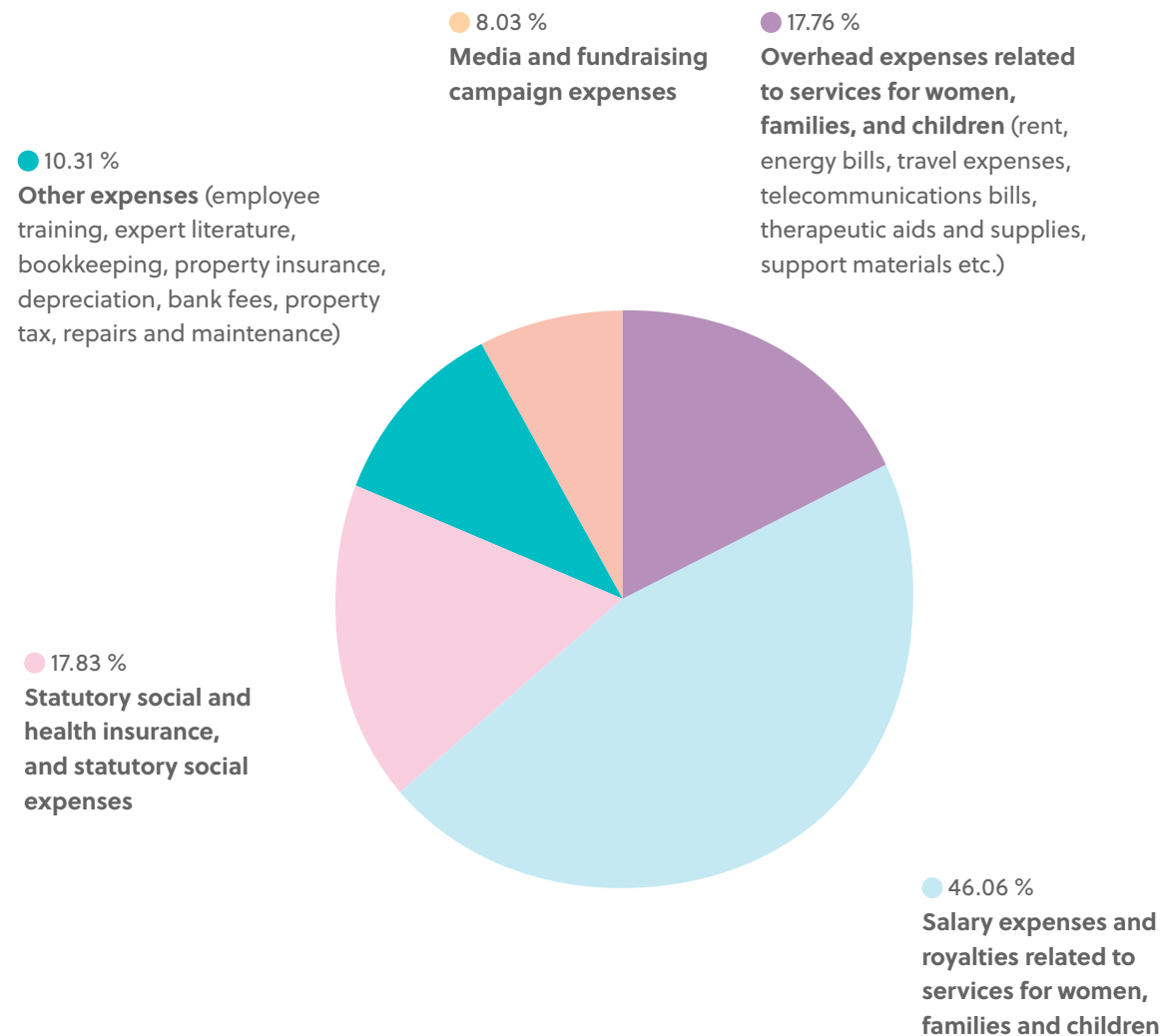
